Our Wednesday night classes are being taught by our two interns, Hannah Kellum and Lucas Lawrence. By the way, if you haven’t had the opportunity to meet them, come on by and say hello. They are sitting with the youth group so make sure you come grab them after services. So our interns are teaching our Wednesday classes and they are teaching on “Joy.” They each taught this past Wednesday and I wanted to give you the highlights and how it impacted me.

I sat in Lucas’ class after a rather long first part of the week. I was a little discouraged because I felt like I was two steps behind on everything I needed to get done. I felt inwardly stressed and it was beginning to manifest on the outside as well. Then, in steps Lucas and our discussion about joy.

We talked about how “Joy” is very different from “Happiness.” Happiness, like any other emotion, is a very temporary disposition. Our emotions go up and down with life and are heavily dependent on our circumstances. Joy on the other hand is a choice, a lifestyle, an attitude. It is not consistently choosing to be happy though. Rather, joy is consistently choosing to focus on the only thing that can be consistent in our lives: our relationship with a steady, loving God.

Part of the class centered around Paul and the various obstacles that were in his life and ministry: shipwrecks, beatings, prison, mobs, etc. Paul had a hard life but he also had an incredibly joyful one. Remember, happiness is not the same as joy. Paul chose to focus on God and the reward that was coming. He relied on the strength that can only come from God. Lucas dropped a line in this discussion that really hit me hard on Wednesday night and it applied even more as this week went on. He said, “The strength of Christ is being stabbed in the back by the world, pulling the knife out, and then handing it back to the world hilt first.” Wow, that’s some wisdom right there.

I’m not usually one to outwardly express my emotions and I am usually a pretty level headed guy but Thursday morning I had about had enough of the world punching me in the face. It didn’t feel good! I wasn’t happy... but I could still be joyful. This week, I’ve learned the value of turning to Jesus when you’re taking a beating. If you look to him, the world will still hit you but nothing is as mesmerizing as a God whom you love that will jump in front of the punches for the one he loves.
