Recognizing the value of children

Today is going to be a great day! Many of us are in route to our annual Camp Wetoga mission trip – today our group is worshipping with the Cedar Lane congregation in Tullahoma, Tennessee before continuing our journey to camp later this afternoon. We miss seeing all of you but we know that you’ll be blessed during worship today and that Harry and Sabino will deliver inspiring messages at each of today’s services.

This is a trip that I enjoy making with our young people. It’s inspiring to see how they love and serve this group of children from inner-city Atlanta. Their availability to these kids isn’t just for one week during the summer – our teens

continue to keep up with their campers throughout the year via phone calls and texts. The relationships that are formed are really beautiful to see – especially in a society that is too often separated along racial and socio-economic lines.

As I think about children who live in tough inner-city environments I think about what the Scriptures say about the value and worth of children. Psalm 127:3 calls children a “heritage from the Lord”. Jesus told his followers “See that you do not despise one of these little ones” and Paul, on several occasions, spoke about the responsibilities of parents to children and of children to parents. God recognizes what a valuable

resource our children are.

I’m thankful to be a part of a church family that also values children. I’m grateful for Caleb and Bridgette, all of our youth volunteers, Bible class teachers, coordinators, and Children’s ministry deacons who are so passionate about teaching and training our kids. Thank you for all that you do!
