Set Apart

God has a unique calling for our lives

KEITH KILMER - I continue to reflect on our men’s retreat from a couple of weeks ago. We talked about how we are to be holy and how the Holy Spirit equips and empowers us for the task. To be holy is to be “set apart”. This is reflected in Lev. 20:26 where God says to Israel “You shall be holy to me, for I the Lord am holy and I have separated you from the peoples, that you should be mine.” Holiness requires that we talk, think, act, and respond differently from those in the world.

At the same time, God places us in the midst of people. Just as God in his holiness dwelt in the Holy of Holies positioned in the center of the Israelite camp so we find ourselves surrounded by others as God makes his dwelling in our hearts.

Our hope and prayer is that others will see God in us and be attracted to what they see. Our lives should touch and impact the lives of those in the surrounding culture.

Every day we are reminded and made aware that the world doesn’t share our values. The challenge for us is to impact our culture rather than to be impacted by our culture. This morning we have an opportunity to draw near to God in worship, to be reminded of our calling, and to encourage one another in our pursuit of holiness.

As we leave here we go back out among those who aren’t pursuing holiness. How can we be a light to them? What can we do to ease their burdens and alleviate their hurts? Do they see

the Spirit of Holiness living in us? God’s intent is not that we be “set apart” so as to not be “in the midst” of others – nor is His intent that we live our lives “in the midst” of the world oblivious to the fact that we are “set apart”. God did both and calls us to the same.
