Some things are best forgotten; other things are worth remembering

KEITH KILMER - Happy Memorial Day weekend! If you are visiting with us over the long weekend we are so happy and blessed that you are here. We are also prayerful for the safety of those of our number who are traveling this weekend and we look forward to seeing them again next week.

According to Scripture some things are best forgotten. God himself forgets our sins when we repent and turn from them (Heb. 8:12). Likewise, we are called to forgive and forget when others hurt us. This is a healthy forgetfulness. Granted, "forgetfulness" in these contexts doesn't mean that our memories are wiped clean but simply that we choose to not dwell on the past or hold it against those who have wronged us.

The Bible also teaches us that we do well to remember that which should be remembered. Some people forget God (Jer. 2:32). Much of our spiritual health is dependent upon remembering those things that are of first importance; this is why we gather around the Lord's Table each week to reflect on Jesus' sacrifice (I Cor. 11:24).
