The Path to Joy

Scripture shows us how to have joy in spite of circumstances

KEITH KILMER - Good morning! I'm with many of our teens and sponsors in route to Camp Wetoga today. This is only my second time to go, but it's evident to me how our youth group has built lasting and influential relationships through the years with the kids from inner city Atlanta who attend the camp. Please pray that we will bless many lives this week.

I know that you will be blessed by Trent's message this morning. Open your minds and hearts as Trent talks on the subject of wisdom today. We'll resume our study from Galatians next Sunday morning (we'll be in chapter 2 if you want to read ahead)!

I love the words of Phil. 4:4-9 that identifies the path to joy

in the life of a Christian. Paul writes: *"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God... Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable – if anything is excellent or praiseworthy – think about such things. Whatever you have learned or received... put it into practice. And the peace of God will be with you."*

Paul identifies for us three steps along the path to joy. First, comes **Right Praying** – *"by prayer and petition present your requests to*

God." The next step to joy is **Right Thinking** as Paul encourages us to think about things that are noble, right, pure, lovely, admirable, excellent and praiseworthy. Finally, joy will come with **Right Living** – *"Whatever you have learned or received– put it into practice."*

Has your life been lacking in joy? Scripture gives us the roadmap for finding it again. Focus on **Right Praying, Right Thinking, and Right Living!**
