Upside Down Leadership

Biblical leadership is out of the norm

Keith Kilmer - Good morning!
It’s a blessing to be together once again today. We want to thank you all for your patience and flexibility last weekend as weather-related changes were made to our schedule of services. I thought the mid-afternoon worship service actually turned out to be a nice change-of-pace.

Yesterday our elders, deacons, and ministers had a morning leadership “retreat” here at the building. These men are a great blessing to Robinson Avenue. We are blessed with Shepherds who truly love and care about the flock, deacons who are motivated and active, and I’m blessed with ministry co-workers who have a passion for the Kingdom.

The biblical leadership model is so much different than any worldly model. Jesus’ ministry

shows us that God’s Kingdom is a topsy-turvy place where the first are last and the last are first (Mt. 19:30), the poor are rich (Lk. 1:53), the foolish are wise (I Cor. 1:25), and the weak are strong (II Cor. 12:9). This has some pretty radical implications for leadership.

The first disciples didn’t catch on right away to Jesus’ leadership model. They sometimes argued about their status and position. On one occasion Jesus answered them this way: “You know the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be your slave...” (Mt. 20:25-26).

Leadership isn’t about “lording it over” or “exercising authority” - it’s about humble service. Be sure and let our elders and deacons know how much you appreciate their servant-leadership!
