Guard your Heart!

How to be "heart-healthy" spiritually

We are so glad that you are here today for this last Sunday morning assembly of the month of June. I know that this is a busy time for trips and vacations. Our prayers are with members who are traveling this summer. At the same time we are grateful for the presence of guests who have traveled to Springdale and are with us today.

We hear so much these days about being "hearthealthy". We are encouraged to exercise, watch our diets, get routine check-ups, etc. But when Scripture talks about the heart seldom is it in reference to the physical organ that pumps our blood. In a text that we'll look at this evening during the 6pm service the Hebrew writer emphasizes guarding our

hearts spiritually. He says "do not harden your hearts" (v.8), "their hearts are always going astray" (v.10), and "See to it that none of you has a sinful, unbelieving heart" (v.12). He wanted to convey to his readers the absolute necessity of protecting their hearts at all costs.

In Proverbs we find these

words: "Above all else, guard your heart, for it is the wellspring of life." A wellspring is defined as an original and bountiful source of something. Our heart is the source of a well-lived life. We often speak well of people when we say things like "He has such a kind heart" or "She is so warmhearted". We recognize the value of people who have kept their hearts pure!

This is one of the reasons why our times of assembly are so very important. We are about to do a "heartcheck". We are able to test the condition of our hearts as we draw near to God in worship and as we edify and encourage one another. Let's leave here today with hearts that have been strengthened.

Caleb Says...

Secularization + Pluralism = Privatization

I had the pleasure this week of attending Uplift again and hearing B. Chris Simpson speak. He told us that this is the most deathly formula of our time. This equation is the great reversal of this generation.

At one point in my life, I was a "don't let the peas touch the potatoes" kind of guy. Now I just mix it all into a nice pile of deliciousness which is the exact opposite of secularization. Secularization tells us that we ought to have our life compartmentalized. Your peas cannot touch the potatoes on the plate! This carries over into every aspect of our lives. Our work life must be separate from our home life. Our personal life must be separate from our public one and can you imagine what would happen if we let our spiritual life spill over into any of those? Secularization forces us to section off our lives.

Pluralism is the idea that there are many truths, all of which are equally true. Odds are that you could probably think of many times where pluralism has been played out on the world stage. We see competing ideologies going at it, both claiming to be the truth. As Christians, we treat other ideologies with respect, but we also must believe that there is truth in the fact that Jesus is the way. What would happen if someone stood up and claimed that there was one truth?

When your life is sectioned off, you are told that your faith is not the only truth, and then you believe it, our spiritual lives become privatized. What should be the most public, all-encompassing part of our lives is forced into its own little compartment that is pulled out in only certain contexts. The results are catastrophic. Like B. Chris said, this is the most deathly formula of our time.

Jesus' ministry was a primarily and profoundly public one! Jesus did not shy away or allow his life to be compartmentalized. His relationship with the Father spilled over into every part of his life. In other words, Jesus was all about letting the peas touch the potatoes. My prayer for you this week is that you don't fall into this trap of believing your faith should be a private affair. Let Jesus influence your work life, home life, private life, and public life.
