In the youth class this week, we looked at Luke 2 and its protagonist, Mary the mother of Jesus. Our goal was to put ourselves in her shoes, in order to know what it must have been like to walk in the path of this incredibly complex woman. However, before we look at Mary in chapter 2, we have to understand Mary from chapter 1.

Flashback. Mary, likely a young teenage girl, was engaged to be married to Joseph. For the past nine months, Mary has come into contact with God's handiwork repeatedly. She was miraculously found to be pregnant after talking with Gabriel and so was her relative, Elizabeth. When she visited Elizabeth and said hi, that caused Elizabeth's baby to jump inside of her and for Elizabeth to be filled with the Holy Spirit. Mary was then filled with a song glorifying God! For the next three months, she and Elizabeth hung out and talked about all of this.

Now in chapter 2, she has traveled to Bethlehem where she has given birth. In addition, strangers have recognized who she and her child were and proceeded to tell everyone they could that the savior of Israel and prophesied son of God, her new born baby, has finally come.

The shepherds can't help but tell other people about what they have seen: angels, the messiah. That's something worth telling and those who hear what the shepherds have to say are amazed at the content of their message. Could this really be the longawaited messiah? Everyone is very openly excited about this and then there's Mary. It says, "Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart." That is a very introspective way of handling these events. Why is Mary acting differently?

Mary is both the mother of a new born baby boy and the mother of Emmanuel, God in the flesh. She takes all of these things in and treasures them. Mary makes me think of a line from Titanic. Elderly Rose says, "A woman's heart is a deep ocean of secrets." Mary is a character with depth. She is so much more than the vessel through which Jesus comes to earth. She is one who's life is intricately woven with God's story, which is an experience worth treasuring.
