This morning in class, the youth group studied Luke 5-6. Among the many stories present in the chapters, Luke recounts a small part of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount in chapter 6. Part of it really strikes me.

In 6:17-19, a large assortment of "undesirables" has accumulated around Jesus hoping to be healed or to get a glimpse of him. The text says that people had only to touch Him and they would be healed. They were there looking for a physical treatment, but Jesus also chose to provide spiritual treatment.

He pronounces blessings upon them: the poor, the hungry, those who weep, those who are hated and insulted. This was welcome news to a large crowd of people who likely identified with a few of these descriptions. However, Jesus then goes on to provide a list of "woes." He lists the rich, those who are well fed, those who laugh, and those who are well spoken of. This was a critique of the elites of society such as the Jewish leaders, government officials, or the broader wealthy class.

Food for thought here. Feel free to speculate and talk with others about it! The goal is to spark a conversation. How do these lists apply to a 21st century American context? Should we take them literally or figuratively? Does this passage convict you or liberate you? What do you think this passage is saying to you and those around
