Who is Jesus?

With so many different images of Jesus, where do we find truth?

What a blessing it is to be together once again. If you are visiting with us today we hope that you will feel welcomed and blessed. Please give us the opportunity to visit with you and get to know you better – we are always so encouraged by the presence of guests in our assemblies.

We're spending an entire year focusing on Jesus. Of course as Christians he should always be our focus – but this year Jesus is the subject of every Sunday morning sermon. We just completed a series entitled "Christianity is Christ" and today we begin a new series called "The Incredible Christ." In this new series we'll be looking at the attributes that drew people to Jesus during his time on earth as well as those attributes that continue to draw people to him today.

In the book "The Jesus I Never Knew" author Philip Yancey describes

the difficulties in forming a full and complete picture of Jesus. For example, sometimes we only see the Sunday School image of Jesus – tame and gentle; other times we are confronted with the Cosmic Jesus who is powerful and sovereign over all creation. No single image captures all of the attributes of Jesus but each contributes to a complete understanding of him.

I've stood at the feet of various stone statues of Jesus in places such as Santiago, Chile; Rio de Janeiro, Brazil; and even in Eureka Springs, Arkansas. In two of these statues Jesus has his arms outstretched in a welcoming posture – in the other (the one in Chile) his arms are outstretched because he is nailed to the cross. Each statue presents the truth about Jesus though they are different (not contradictory) truths – he is both a suffering Christ and a welcoming Christ.

I hope that you'll continue on this journey with us this year to know him better. Today we'll be looking at a common response to Jesus during his ministry – people were amazed! What would it take for us to recapture that sense of amazement whenever we encounter Christ?

This is the final week of our winter series in the youth class. Make sure you thank Tyler Bond, Tyler Quinn, and Caleb Bryant for their hard work these last few months. Next Sunday will be the first of our new series, “Eden, Emmanuel, Eternity, and Everything In Between.”

This week we will take a look at Hebrews 5. Jesus was a man who wore many hats. He was a teacher, a prophet, the lamb, the Son of God. He has many titles, and Hebrews 5 focuses on one of those titles: the Great High Priest.

In the Old Testament, there were many priests who had various jobs. They did everything from sacrificing burnt offerings to performing rituals. The high priest had a special job though. This one man would purify himself and atone for his own sins. Then on the day of atonement, he would go into the Holy of Holies offer sacrifices, pray on the behalf of Israel, and among other things, place Israel’s sins on an animal sacrifice. The high priest was a mediator on whom Israel was completely dependent.

Fast forward to Jesus life. Hebrews describes Jesus as the Great High Priest which means he is better than all those who came before him. He is superior because “he was tempted in every way as we are – yet was without sin. Although he was a son [of God], he learned obedience from what he suffered and, once made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him.” Jesus did not have to atone for his own sins. He was perfect which allows him to go into the presence of God. He did not place our sins on an animal sacrifice. Rather, he became the sacrifice, something none of his predecessors were capable of doing, and his blood covered the sins of the people. Jesus’ role as the Great High Priest is one of his most important because it is only through his priestly actions that we can have a relationship with God.
