The Impact of Generosity

The lasting effects of generosity can extend for generations

Jesus stands as the ultimate model of radical generosity. Paul says of Jesus in 2 Cor. 8:9 that "he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich." Of course, we know that Jesus was never materially wealthy – his riches are in reference to what he had prior to the incarnation and to how much he gave up in coming to earth. Paul describes this in Phil. 2:6-8 when he says that Jesus "being in very nature God...made himself nothing...he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death - even death on a cross!" There can be no greater example of generosity than that.

We want to be like Jesus — to model our lives after him, to think his thoughts, to give others a glimpse of him in us. One of the ways that we can do this is by being generous. We can be generous is the time we invest in others, we

can be generous with kind words and compliments, and we can be generous with our material and monetary resources.

I've seen the great generosity of this congregation on display so many times! I witness it each time we collect and distribute clothing to our community, I see it when our members come down front to support others who respond to the invitation on Sunday mornings, and I'm amazed by the way this church family responds to specific financial requests whether it be a ministry endeavor, disaster relief, or some other worthy project. Generosity has even greater power in that it often outlives us. Consider some of the visionary men and women who purchased land and materials for the building we are in now -aplace that continues to serve us and this community over forty years later.

Today we'll talk about the Generous Jesus – this message is part of a larger presentation from our Shepherds about our plans to renovate and remodel our church auditorium. I'm very excited about the opportunities that we have in front of us to enhance our worship, celebrate growth, and reach out to and minister to newcomers. This project has been approached prayerfully and with an eye toward the future. I know that you'll be encouraged by what is shared today!

This morning was the first of our Spring series, "Eden, Emmanuel, Eternity, and Everything In Between." Be sure to ask your kids about it, and if they weren't in class this week, be sure to come next Sunday at 9:30 as we begin with "God's Presence in Eden." Should be a fun class!

This week we are looking at Hebrews 6. I want to consider what solid spiritual food is with you. Let's begin with a chunk of scripture from Hebrews 5:12; 6:1-3.

"Though you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you the elementary truths of God's Word all over again. You need milk not solid food! Therefore, let us leave the elementary teachings about Christ, not laying again the foundation of repentance from acts that lead to death, and of faith in God, instruction about baptisms, the laying on of hands, the resurrection from the dead, and eternal judgement. And God permitting, we will do so."

Did anyone else just get punched in the nose by these verses? The author lists out what he considers to be "elementary teachings" and that list is full of things that I think about all of the time. Is my faith elementary? Am I not "acquainted with teaching on righteousness? This question has always plagued me. What counts as solid spiritual food? What lesson out there is deeper than God and his plan for salvation? It amazes me how often we can completely miss the point when we look away from the text. Hebrews 6:9-11 has the answer.

"Even though we speak like this, dear friends, we are confident of better things in your case – things that accompany salvation. God is not unjust; he will not forget your work and the love you have shown him as you have helped his people and continue to help them. We want each of you to show the same diligence to the very end, in order to make your hope sure."

It's not a deeper teaching or a profound sermon. Solid spiritual food is what happens when the spiritual milk you received is acted on. We become mature when those elementary teachings lead us to live a life that reflects what we were taught.
