Good morning everyone! You might be looking around wondering why a good chunk of our members are missing. Is there an epic game of hide and seek you are not privy to? Are you on a hidden camera show? O contraire my friend! This morning the youth group is in Russellville attending CHRISTeens and the ladies are away on their annual retreat. Both groups will be returning later this evening. We cannot wait to be with you all again!

I have been looking forward to this article for weeks because we are going to talk about one of the coolest and least known characters in scripture: The High Priest Melchizedek. Drum roll please! Here we go

Melchizedek's story only encompasses seven verses of Genesis 14. So what makes Melchizedek so great that the author of Hebrews claims he was greater than Abraham and the priestly predecessor to Jesus himself? According to Genesis 14:18-24, Abraham was blessed by Melchizedek, the priest king of Salem, and paid a tenth of his plunder to the king. Sounds pretty normal to me.

Hebrews explains why this is so significant: "Just think how great he was: even the patriarch Abraham gave him a tenth of the plunder! Now the law requires the descendants of Levi who become priests to collect a tenth from the people even though their brothers [the people] are descended from Abraham. This man, however, did not trace his descent from Levi, yet he collected a tenth from Abraham and blessed him who had the promises. And without the lesser was blessed by the greater. One might even say that Levi, who collects the tenth, paid the tenth through Abraham, because when Melchizedek met Abraham, Levi was still in the body of his ancestor."

Here, the author argues for a certain hierarchy: Israelites < Levites (Priests) < Melchizedek. Melchizedek is greater than the priesthood which means that "perfection could not be achieved through the Levitical priesthood." The old way was insufficient and so the world anticipated someone greater, a priest in the order of Melchizedek, to bring a new law. That long-awaited high priest was, and is, Jesus. "You are a priest forever in the order of Melchizedek. The former regulation is set aside because it was weak and useless and a better hope is introduced by which we draw near to God. Because Jesus lives forever, he has a permanent priesthood. Therefore, he is able to save completely those who come to God through him, because he always lives to intercede for them." Make sure you read all of Chapter 7 for a better understanding since I can't explain any better than the text does!
