Head, Heart, and Hands A disciple is someone who seeks to be Jesus' presence in the world

I hope that you have had a good Spring Break! I'm sure that many of those who have traveled this past week are starting to make their way back into town this weekend. We want to welcome back those who have been away and continue to pray for the safety of those who are still traveling. We also hope and pray that that our young people, teachers, and school administrators will finish the school year strong as they prepare for the home-stretch.

Our elders and ministry staff have been reading a book entitled "Disciple Shift." It's a book about how to make disciples who will, in turn, make other disciples. Discipleship is at the heart of the Christian mission. Jesus said in the Great Commission: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I

have commanded you."

But to make disciples we must first know what it means to be a disciple. Jesus' call in Matthew 4:19 could be used as a starting point; there Jesus says "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." From this single verse we see three implied imperatives: A disciple must follow Jesus ("follow me"), a disciple must be transformed ("I will make you"), a disciple must take action ("fishers of men"). Each phase is a part of the discipleship process.

This is a process that involves the head the heart and the hands. To follow Jesus is to intellectually accept him as Lord and Savior (head), to allow ourselves to be changed by him (heart), and then to be committed to his mission (hands). Where are you in this process? Maybe you have yet to accept him. Perhaps you have believed in him but haven't allowed him

to transform your heart. It could be that you are delaying the final step of discipleship being used by Christ for his purposes. Consider what he is calling you to – this is what it means to be a disciple.

Good morning everyone! Our summer interns, Hannah Kellum and Lucas Lawrence, will be visiting Robinson Avenue on March 29-31! I hope you can be here to meet our interns and help them feel welcome.

If you are a fan of the Old Testament or you grew up in the church, chances are that some of your favorite bible characters are listed in Hebrews 11: Abel, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, Rahab, Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, David, Samuel, and the prophets. This chapter is commonly known as the "Faith Hall of Fame" because every individual listed in the chapter accomplished something "through faith."

Chapter 11 follows a plea from the author for Christians to be confident in the face of eminent hardship and persecution. Hebrews 10:37-39 says "For in just a very little while, 'He who is coming will come and will not delay. But my righteous one will live by faith. And if he shrinks back, I will not be pleased with him.' But we are not of those who shrink back and are destroyed, but of those who believe and are saved." In the eyes of the author, believing in God in the face of trials is central to living as a Christian. In fact, he says you cannot be one if you shrink away from persecution. We MUST be confident because a lack of confidence shows a lack of faith in God.

With certain hardship on the horizon, the author of Hebrews decides that the best thing to inspire his readers was to remind them of some of their favorite stories. The stories that are referenced are stories of individuals who "conquered kingdoms, administered justice, and gained what was promised; who shut the mouths of lions, quenched the fury of the flames, and escaped the edge of the sword; whose weakness was turned to strength; and who became powerful in battle and routed foreign armies." Israel, although they had the God of the universe on their side, was relatively small and vulnerable at first glance. Because of their apparent weakness, they were on the receiving end of the spear of some of the most powerful nations in the ancient world. However, with God fighting for them, even the most insignificant members of Hebrew society could be the one to lead the fight. That's a pretty awesome thing for the Christians to be able to look back on. God had a proven track record of fighting for his people and using anyone who trusted him, despite their short-comings. God could use the Christians, religious outcasts in Israel and abroad, to do his will.

The same is true for you. There are hardships coming for you. Whether it is troubles with your job, family, friends, health, or faith, we will have to make a choice. The choice is simple, have faith or don't. Sound hard? It is!!! I am scared of trusting God sometimes. I am scared about so many things. How do I know God will take care of me?

I will leave you with what the author of Hebrews did. We are called to have faith in God in all circumstances and when that becomes hard, look at those people who came before you who are a testament to the fact that God is faithful to those who have faith in him. "These were all commended for their faith, yet none of them received what had been promised. God had planned something better for us so that only together with us would they be made perfect
